OBITUARIES

GORDON JOSEPH GADSBY - 2nd June 1931 – 13th March 2015

I joined Stapleford Community Association Camera Club when I was 21 – still there 37 years later – how time flies. Gordon and Ken Bryan were key members of the club at the time, being, without doubt, experts in landscape and mountain photography. I spoke to Ken the day Gordon passed away – Ken said that it was through Gordon’s encouragement and advice that he became a landscape photographer – sufficient praise indeed.

Gordon and his wife Margaret were leading lights in the club the years we were associated with NEMPF, and later when the club became the Stapleford Travel and Photographic Society. He was vice chairman and chairman for so many years, and his enthusiasm for enjoying and photographing the world we share encouraged many others to do the same.

He organised many walking, climbing and cycling trips to Snowdonia, Scotland and other places which many members enjoyed, giving the opportunity to share his passion for the mountains and develop photographic skills. Unfortunately, being a teacher and limited to term times and timetables, I was unable to join in many of these trips. I do, though, remember myself and my eldest son Nick meeting up with Gordon and Margaret, along with Rick and Cathy Eagles to climb Schiehallion in April 2003. A fantastic day - my first Munro with a digital camera, first close up view of ptarmigan, stunning scenery and an expert guide.

We looked forward to Gordon’s ‘Chairman’s Evenings’ at the club when he would present his latest work on the Kodak Carousel with Margaret acting as his technical assistant. His focus was on those magnificent peaks and landscapes not forgetting the plants, flowers and wildlife that he saw along the way. His presentations always include superb verbal detail of the subject - delivered from memory, no notes needed.

He was an expert; both in composition and the technical side of photography – without the convenience of digital technology until recent years. He knew how to handle his Nikon and Kodachrome 25 to produce images to impress.

Gordon inspired and encouraged so many members to show their work at the club who would not normally have done so. His quiet, yet infectious, enthusiasm for the great outdoors and creative photography is something we will miss almost as much as the man himself.

EXHIBITION by North East Lincolnshire Photographic Society (NELPS)

Formed in 1955, North East Lincolnshire Photographic Society is in its Diamond Jubilee year. NELPS held their 2015 biennial exhibition in Cleethorpes Library from Monday 1 to Saturday 6 June,

The exhibition gave our members the opportunity to exhibit up to 5 prints of their own choice, so there were around 100 prints on show. Subjects could be anything from landscape and portrait through architecture and nature to close-up and creative, using a variety of photographic techniques. Our members range from those who are relatively new to photography to those who possess a wealth of talent and experience, including national honours and acceptances in national exhibitions and photographic magazines.

Members were on hand throughout the exhibition's opening hours to talk about the prints on display and answer queries about the exhibition, the club or about photography in general.

NELPS meets weekly at the Annie Chapple Centre, Belvoir Road, Cleethorpes at 7.30pm on Wednesday evenings and visitors are always welcome. We enjoy a varied programme including local speakers and those of national repute, digital imaging workshops covering the use of cameras and manipulating images in Photoshop (or similar programs), numerous competitions both internal and external and practical evenings for hands on photography.

N&EMPF PDI KNOCKOUT – 15th March 2015

Numbers this year were a little down on previous years, but still more than were competing at the end of the slide era. At Warwick last year, none of the N&EMPF clubs made it into the final so everybody was on an equal footing competing for the 2 places to represent N&EMPF at the national event.

The format for the competition was exactly the same as the last six years – a preloaded first round of 16 images followed by a final for the top eight clubs of 20 images with at least 10 previously unseen for the top 8 clubs.

The judges were John Lacey, Brian Hemsworth & Christine Hodgson and the marks they handed out are all in the table below.

In the first round the field basically stretched out as the marks built up, no particular groups became apparent, but the objective of this round is just to get into the final. As there was a tie in eighth place, 9 clubs went into the final where the real competition starts.

When I went home after the event I watched my recording of the Australian Formula 1 Grand Prix, where the two Mercedes drivers had finished a couple of seconds apart and then there was a 30 second gap to the third – the final of this event was very similar. Rolls-Royce pulled away right from the start and left the rest to fight over second place – a total of 15 marks covering the 8 clubs shows that they were reasonably evenly matched but a gap of 19 between 1st and 2nd just demonstrates RR's domination. They were the only club which managed to increase the average mark per image over so it appears that the secret is to not show the whole hand in round 1 but keep a few good ones back for the final – think about that for next year.

So, it is congratulations to Rolls-Royce and Deepings who will represent N&EMPF at Warwick on the 11th July. Congratulations to Julie Donovan of Newark who won the best image award with “Masquerade”.

Thanks to Peter C, Dave G, Dave S and the Beeston projection team for both the work and loan of the equipment.
