OBITUARY

PETER ERNEST HARVEY APAGB - 10th March 1924 - 9th February 2017

Peter Ernest Harvey joined the Peterborough Photographic Society on 8th. October 1963. Joined the committee on 7th. December 1964 then became secretary on 7th. June 1966. Became Hon Life Member on 27th. January 1972 and was one of the first APAGB in May 1984 APAGB the Award for Meritorious Service for the Photographic Alliance of Great Britain which started in 1984.

Peter then became President in 1993 -1995 He then finally became treasurer in 1998 to 2014

Peter's funeral was on 8th. March 2017 when over 20 members Celebrated his life.

KEN SIMCOX ARPS MPAGB - 15th April 1934 - 11th February 2017

Ken Simcox grew up in Warley, West Midlands, and, following an apprenticeship with the Gas Board, joined Dowty as a research and development engineer. He was involved with the development of Concorde's power and hydraulic systems, working at both Filton and Toulouse.

In the early 80's, together with his wife Jennifer, he went into business as J K Pro Lab; fittingly Ken provided a transparency development and mounting service. Many prominent photographers from the West Midlands and farther afield used his services. After some twenty years, the business closed at the end of 2000.

One of his best customers was the late Frank Young who became a great friend. At this time, Ken was an active member at Smethwick PS, being a regular at the studio sessions. Frank finally persuaded Ken to join Tamworth PC in 1989. He was co-opted onto the Committee in 1991 and became Chairman, for the first time, in 1993. He was General Secretary from 1994 until 2007. In 1998 Ken took on the Chairmanship of the Midland Salon and together with Frank Young, and members of Tamworth PC, ran the competition for the last time until it's recent revival.

During the nineties, we were still using film and Ken's forte was transparencies, with such images as "Ice Maiden" and "White Sails"; the latter image was taken at Beaumaris using one of his own manufactured convex perspex filters. A slide, titled "The Mask", won a PSA Gold medal at

Southampton; a feat neither he or the slide ever repeated. A fact he often referred to when discussing the vagaries of competitions and judges! The new millennium saw great advances in digital photography, in which Ken revelled. It was an ideal opportunity for Ken to address the frustrated artist within and become the "Artful Dodger". Ken was very competitive, both at club and national levels. In November1999 he gained his MPAGB with a selection of slides at the same time as his great friend Frank Young.

He was still actively involved on the Committee and took a great interest in the achievements of the Club and individual members. Ken always took a keen interest in the MCPF Print and PDI Championships and both he and Jennifer were at Ormskirk, last November, when the Club represented the MCPF at the PAGB Print Championships.

After a relatively short illness, Ken peacefully passed away on 11th February 2017.

Our best wishes go to Jennifer and her family.
