### **OBITUARY**

#### Cliff Paulson APAGB - Bolsover Camera Club - 1st July 2017

Cliff and I first became acquainted about 35 years ago when he joined Bolsover Camera Club and we have remained friends ever since.

In his earlier days, he did his National Service attached to the Royal Signal Corps in Germany which is probably where he developed his interest in things technical. Being very fond of music, he demanded the best quality equipment to give him quality sound and he was a musician in his own right. Among other instruments he played clarinet in a local jazz band and in a local dance orchestra.

His working career was with the Coalite and Chemical Company where he did research into bitumen based road surfacing materials. When Coalite began to downsize, Cliff was made redundant and he started his own business as a videographer and photographer. He made many commercial videos for promotional and training purposes and photographed many weddings often with his wife Betty assisting with the videos.

His wide range of interests included a number of local societies and clubs including the Bolsover Civic Society, Bolsover Camera Club, Chesterfield Film Makers, Cavendish Probus Club and the Chesterfield Canal Trust. In all of these he played an active part in trying to increase membership and in raising funds and suggesting activities.

He was interested in many aspects of technology both in connection with photography and videography and in the outside world. He was the first to introduce colour printing to the Camera Club and to demonstrate digital photography using a very early system borrowed from a local friend. His special interests were in railways and in canals.

He really put everything he had into his activities. Being a found member of the Chesterfield Cine Society (later Chesterfield Film Makers) he became a life president and was a judge and lecturer/demonstrator in video work at clubs around the region.

He was several times President of the Camera Club and was made a Life Vice President. He always wanted to move forward and encouraged members to try something new like wide angle photography and colour shows for the public. He was particularly instrumental in producing the club's Millennium Project along with several other members. The show transferred to video and sold to many ex-pats all over the world, making some two thousand pounds for the Club. His interest in photography was very personal. He took photographs purely for his own use and had no interest in gaining distinctions or winning competitions. Nevertheless, he enjoyed looking at the work of others.

In recognition of his services to photography and videography he was awarded an APAGB, the Photographic Alliance of Great Britain Award for Meritorious Service.

In the Probus Club he gave many talks on such subjects as the history of the railways, the Settle to Carlisle Line. The Life of Frank Hornby as well as providing musical entertainment at social events.

On a personal level I will remember Cliff for his loyalty and friendship and for his prodigious memory as well as his store of jokes and one-liners, many from sayings of Sir Thomas Beecham and often fairly risqué. His knowledge of classical music was encyclopaedic and he frequently advised me on choice of music for my own AV presentations.

Above all else he was a family man being very proud of his achievements of his son and daughters.

He will be a loss to all of the various bodies to which he belonged and I for one will miss him.

## PAGB AWARDS FOR PHOTOGRAPHIC MERIT (APM) IN AUDIO VISUAL

We have set a venue and a weekend for the next Adjudication - Sat 26 May & Sun 27 May 2018 at the Wilmslow Guild, 1 Bourne Street, Wilmslow, Cheshire SK9 5HD.

For this to proceed the APM Secretary will need to have received at least 8 applications by 31 December 2017, so you have plenty of time to get organised. If we do not receive sufficient applications, by December, for at least one day we will have to cancel the Adjudication. Currently we have 3 applications at CPAGB level plus 1 DPAGB and 2 CPAGB who have expressed an interest. Remember that the PAGB APM/AV welcome and encourage "Photo Harmony" sequences.

Photo Harmony is encouraged, particularly at CPAGB, but also at DPAGB and even at MPAGB.

### PAGB DEFINITION OF PHOTO HARMONY

<u>PHOTO HARMONY</u> should demonstrate skill in the production and visual progression of still photographs linked to sound. No script or commentary with a specific beginning, middle and ending are required but the images must flow well in a pleasing progression, not just in a random manner. The emphasis is on visual harmony in colour, tone or graphic design.

The aim is not only to display a collection of photographs which may be excellent when considered individually, but rather a sequence of pictures which blend well with each other and with the sound chosen. Good technique is essential and it is expected that the sound and the pictures will start and finish together and that the original ending of the music is preserved, rather than an arbitrary fade out.

In a successful Photo Harmony sequence the Adjudicators will expect virtually all the pictures to be the entrant's own photography with a proportion better than just competent standard at CPAGB and much better than competent at DPAGB. To succeed at MPAGB the photography in a Photo Harmony production must be of an exceptionally high standard in both content and quality. Pa

I have received a complaint from one Secretary who I am aware does the job correctly and I apologise if you though I included you in the bunch.

The problems continue and Clubs who want to use emails should look at the Booking/Reply/Reminder forms in the PAGB Handbook for the information required. The most often missed to me is Public Liability Insurance and I have to go back and ask them if they have it. Sending the same dates to various Lecturers/Judges is not polite when they reply and are told it has been taken by somebody else. You should only send the dates to one and await a reply or use the telephone. I have had recent experience of it and so have other Lecturers and Judges who have informed me that it has happened to them.

Our Lecturers and Judges are volunteers and give masses of time to the Clubs so please treat them with respect.

### **WARWICK 2017**

The PAGB Inter-Club PDI Championship has become known as "Warwick" and we have been going there for nearly 30 years.

This year's battle between 38 Clubs, 2 nominated by each of the fifteen Federations and the 8 Finalists from 2016 took place on Saturday 15 July 2017.

N&EMPF had 3 clubs competing, Worksop Photographic Club and Synergy who qualified at our competition after the AGM and Rolls-Royce (Derby) PS who were finalists in 2016.

The usual Warwick format of a first and second round of eight images gave us 8 for the final with Rolls-Royce in  $2^{nd}$  place. Worksop and Synergy competed in the Plate Competition – Synergy finishing in  $8^{th}$  place and Worksop = $12^{th}$ .

Rolls-Royce did very well in the Final when all the Clubs put up 20 images, 10 of which had to be new and finished up  $4^{th}$ , one place better than in 2016.

Congratulations to Jon Mee (Rolls-Royce (Derby) PS whose image "Highland Winter" was the judges best image in the Championship.

The winners of the Plate were Dumfries CC and the Final was won by Smethwick PS (282), 2<sup>nd</sup> Wigan FC (277) and 3<sup>rd</sup> Arden PG (271).

A great day with nearly 400 people attending and the weather made us happy, as it rained, that we were inside.
