Howard will be presenting A2 and A1 prints from various locations around the globe and introducing the Laws of Photography as determined by Howard Tate. I will touch on the excitement of printing and the satisfaction gained from working on and completing photographic projects. Photographic projects form a considerable portion of my life and I am honoured to be a member of the Gamma Photo forum as a direct result of the projects I carry out. One of my specialities is LINEAR Panoramas and at the conclusion of my talk there will be a digital viewing of two images which are each 2.4m long.

First a little about me: I live in Wigan Lancs UK, when I'm not working, I like to be out and about with my camera. I like a large range of subjects including People, Places and Nature to name but a few. I love to print my finished images, and I am sponsored by FOTOSPEED as one of their Lecturers.

I first became interested in photography after buying a Fuji S7000 Bridge camera whilst on a family trip to London in 2006.

I was impressed by the quality of the images compared to our previous point and click style cameras. I also achieved my FBPE in 2014 which equates to 500 accepted in British Exhibitions with over 50 awards.

My style of photography is still developing in strange directions, with many of my most successful images being composites, with some of the elements being hand drawn.
